*The Diversity of Emerging Capitalisms in Developing Countries* - Eric Rougier 2017-04-06

This book presents the results of a collective and original empirical investigation of the institutional systems underlying the capitalisms that are coming to the fore in developing nations. While varieties of industrialized countries' capitalisms are extensively scrutinized, those of developing countries' capitalisms are far less documented. By implementing a unified and original comparative approach based on the institutional complementarity theory, the different contributors of the book find evidence for the originality and heterogeneity of the forms of capitalism to be observed in developing countries. This text analyses capitalist systems as clusters of sectoral institutions and regulations, identifying differences between these clusters in a large sample of emerging and developing countries. Rougier and Combarnous bring together contributions answering the following questions: What are these clusters of institutions underlying emerging capitalisms? Are there common or specific patterns of institutional clustering across countries and what are the main characteristics of the varieties of capitalism they shape? What are their main long-term determinants? Are there specific patterns of economic outcome associated with these clusters? Can different forms of institutional complementarity be observed? How can we analyse institutional reform from this perspective?

Les différentes contributions ont été rédigées par des catholiques et des protestants, des laïcs et des clercs, tous malgaches à l'exception d'un seul, Sylvain Urfer s'étant par ailleurs chargé du suivi et de l'organisation de l'ensemble.

L'introduction et la conclusion sont de Giulio Cipollone auquel revient la direction de l'ouvrage. Elaboré dans le contexte de la célébration du premier baptême, le 21 juin 1907, sur le territoire du futur diocèse d'Ambatondrazaka, ce livre voudrait être le pionnier d'une plus large exploration du thème Christianisme et droits de l'homme - que ce soit à Madagascar, en Afrique ou ailleurs. L'enjeu, qui touche au dialogue des cultures, est décisif en ces temps de mondialisation triomphante. Parce que l'universalité abstraite des droits de l'homme est remise en cause au nom de l'irréductible singularité de chaque peuple. Et parce que le christianisme est suspecté de ne s'intéresser qu'au spirituel, au détriment de l'homme concret, inséré dans sa société particulière. A ce double défi, ce livre apporte quelques éléments de réponse.

The importance of good land governance to strengthen women's land rights, facilitate land-related investment, transfer land to better uses, use it as collateral, and allow effective decentralization through collection of property taxes has long been recognized. The challenges posed by recent global developments, especially urbanization, increased and more volatile food prices, and climate change have raised the profile of land and the need for countries to have appropriate land policies. However, efforts to improve country-level land governance are often frustrated by technical complexities, institutional fragmentation, vested interests, and lack of a shared vision on how to move towards good land governance and measure progress in concrete settings. Recent initiatives have recognized the important challenges this raises and the need for partners to act in a collaborative and coordinated fashion to address them. The breadth and depth of the papers included in this volume, all of which were presented at the World Bank's Annual Conference on Land Policy and Administration, illustrate the benefits from such collaboration. They are indicative not only of the diversity of issues related to land governance but, more importantly, highlight that, even though the topic is complex and politically challenging, there is a wealth of promising new approaches to improving land governance through innovative technologies, country-wide policy dialogue, and legal and administrative reforms. The publication is based on an on-going partnership between the World Bank, the International Federation of Surveyors, the Global Land Tool Network and the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization provide tools that can help to address land governance in practice and at scale. It is our hope that this volume will be of use to increase awareness of and support to the successful implementation of innovative approaches that can help to not only improve land governance, but also thereby contribute to the well-being of the poorest and the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals.
