The Conjugal Dictatorship of Ferdinand and Imelda Marcos - Primitivo Mijares 2017

Men should not be bound by moral rules invented by their foes. The whole world is a slippery battlefield. Ideal justice demands that the vanquished should be exploited, emasculated, and scorned.
